What is Home & School?

Home & School is the parent volunteer association at Saint Brigid of Kildare School. The Home & School Association strives to enrich the Catholic School experience for students and their families by providing a volunteer base and money for supplemental programs, fun activities, staff appreciation and classroom equipment for St. Brigid School. Some of our events and programs include Barn Bash, Hounds Hoopla, Field Day, Uniform Exchange, Library Volunteers, and much more!

How we're funded:

Home & School is funded entirely by contributions made to the Annual Fund. The Annual Fund is a once a year contribution that covers the costs of after school programs, extracurriculars, school performances and field trips organized by Home & School. We do not hold any fundraisers – we won't ask your children to sell things like wrapping paper, magazines or candy because our tuition rates and Annual Fund cover the costs of all extra activities.

How to Contribute: Annual Fund

Instead of having our children and parents participate in fundraising projects that raise more for the companies sponsoring the sale than for our school, an Annual Fund donation by each family supports the efforts of Home & School at Saint Brigid of Kildare. Each dollar raised goes directly to school projects and improvement. Because of this, we will never ask you or your children to sell items door to door to raise money for our school.

The Annual Fund supports the efforts of our Home & School, including welcome and tours, artists and authors in the school, class parties, class field trips, teacher appreciation, playground supplies, student organizations (ALSO programs), school musicals, new family welcome, classroom wish lists and the teacher education fund, among others.

The general suggested request is \$125 per student in order to meet the needs of the school programs the fund supports. However, any amount is appreciated.

How to Contribute: Gifts of Gratitude

How much do I give?




Once you are registered, St. Brigid of Kildare will display in the Community Rewards section of your account.

Earn Credit for Tuition

RaiseRight (formerly Scrip): Buy Gift Cards ⇒ Save money on your child's 2025-2026 tuition!

Earn credit towards your child's 2025-2026 tuition by buying electronic or physical gift cards from RaiseRight to pay for your everyday shopping and spending year-round including groceries, dining out, home improvement, and everything in between. One hundred percent (100%) of your RaiseRight earnings (from April 1, 2024 - March 31, 2025) is credited to your family's Saint Brigid account for the following year's tuition (2025-2026). St. Brigid does not receive any percentage of the earnings from the RaiseRight program.

How it Works:

- Use the RaiseRight website or app to order gift cards at face value from 750+ brands
 - Pick from eGift cards and physical gift cards
 - eGift cards are available within minutes
 - Physical gift cards orders are only processed by St Brigid once a month according to a set schedule (with delivery ~1 week later)
- Pay via a linked bank account
 - \$0.29 fee on each transaction
- Earn from 1-to-20% towards your child's 2025-2026 tuition on every gift card you buy

The co-chairs are responsible for overseeing all the Home & School committees and working with administration on special events. The co-chairs serve a one year term following a one year term as vice co-chairs. Time commitment: moderate and consistent and includes attending monthly Home & School meetings and assisting administration with special events.

The vice co-chairs assist the co-chairs in overseeing the committees and special school events. The Co-Chairs are also responsible for overseeing the Gifts of Gratitude program in December and May and recognizing birthdays of office staff. They are also responsible for helping manage holiday and end of year gifts for the entire St. Brigid Staff. The position is a one year term before filling a one year term as Co-Chairs. Time commitment: moderate and consistent. The co-chairs should attend the monthly Home & School meetings.
